

Hygiene Concept FSZ Hassfurt e.V.

Version 2.0; 16.06.2020



1. Introduction and applicable documents

This hygiene concept was drawn up for the operation under consideration of the corona pandemic and is valid for the period for which operation under restrictions is necessary for the aforementioned reason. If possible, operation is to start on 30.05.2020. If the legislator should make the Corona Ordinance easier to implement, this will be done accordingly. The hygiene concept is therefore a living document that can be adapted to the actual conditions. If necessary, a new version is created to replace the originally valid version. For general operation, the regulations are based on the guidelines of the German Skydiving Association (DFV), as well as for flight operations (climb) to the guidelines of the EASA, as well as to the specifications of the Bavarian Ministry of the Interior.

Documents in their current form are therefore also considered to be valid documents:

The rules of distance can be complied without any problems on the basis of the rules laid down in this concept. Wherever minimum distances are undercut, infection is counteracted by wearing mouth-nose covers and other personal protective equipment. This follows the rules in the Corona Regulation.

2. Ensuring distances and hygiene

2.1 Hygiene in the Hall/Hangar

Individual packing areas on the total area of the packing mat (for packing the parachutes) of 250 m² are marked by adhesive tape, thus ensuring that each jumper has about 25 m² packing area and that the necessary distances are maintained. The packing mats are cleaned regularly. Outside the hangar, additional packing areas will be made available if necessary under the same circumstances.

A Plexiglas partition will be installed on the manifest. Before the manifest, distance markings at 2 m intervals are applied to the floor in the form of adhesive strips. A maximum of one person may be present in the manifest. The counter at the Manifest is disinfected several times a day. Contactless payment is preferable.

In addition, a dispenser with disinfectant for disinfecting hands will be on the manifest.

Due to the cramped conditions, a maximum of 1 person is allowed in the toilet areas (for men and women). Shower areas are closed for the time being.

Cabin entrances and the toilet areas are cleaned several times a day. Hand washing soap for

Cleaning of hands is available in both toilets, and disinfectant for hands is also available at the exit. Only paper is used to dry the hands.

Access to the kitchen area (max. 4 persons), as well as the training and video room (max. 5 persons) is restricted. Seats are blocked/removed if a distance of at least 1.5m cannot be maintained. They are also regularly disinfected. Within the hangar, face masks are mandatory in closed rooms (toilets, office, training and video room). When the hall door is open (approx. 21 metres long, 12 metres high), a mouthguard can be dispensed with inside the hangar due to the sufficient ventilation (in compliance with the distance rules). If the minimum distance of 1.5 metres is not reached, a mouthguard must be used.

All surfaces touched by the jumpers are regularly cleaned/disinfected (shelves, seating, handles, light switches, etc.).

Rental equipment: Jumping equipment can be rented, but must be cleaned after changing users.

Signs and regular announcements point out the need to comply with the hygiene rules. One or more hygiene officers monitor compliance with the regulations (see paragraph 4: hygiene officer).

2.2 Hygiene in the plane (Ascent)

Here the EASA guidelines are put into force in coordination with the aircraft owner CASEair. The measures recommended there are exceeded to ensure safety.

In particular:

- The climb is considered passenger transport, but the maximum number of jumpers is limited to 18 persons
- It is only possible to jump with gloves, long jump suit, face protection and open helmet (buff/tubular cloth, mouth-nose cover) or alternatively with full face helmet.
- Before boarding the aircraft, please wear gloves and a hose cloth over mouth and nose
- Sit as far apart as possible
- The pilot either wears an oxygen mask, a mouth-nose cover or is separated from the jumpers by structural measures
- At a safe height, the door is partially opened already during the climb to ensure a high air circulation. Furthermore, the ventilation nozzles ensure a constant ventilation of the cabin interior
- The handles and surfaces in the aircraft are cleaned/disinfected regularly (at least every 6 lifts). Also the boarding aid (ladder)

2.3 Hygiene in the bus (Pick-up from landing field)

- The bus is only entered with mouth-and-nose protection
- Sit as far apart as possible
- Regular cleaning and disinfection (same cycle as aircraft)
- Disinfectant is provided on the bus- Entry only through the rear door (ensures distance to the driver)

3. Restricted access

All potential jumpers are advised to stay at home in case of symptoms of illness. Participants with recognizable cold or flu symptoms (general symptoms of illness) will be expelled from the premises. Potential participants must register in advance by e-mail and wait for confirmation of participation. Non-registered or confirmed participants are not allowed to enter the area. Members of the FSZ Hassfurt e.V. have priority over guest jumpers. This ensures that the number of participants does not exceed a reasonable number. Each participant fills out a declaration in which he/she assures that he/she has had no contact with people infected with Corona in the last 14 days and that there are no symptoms of illness. There is a maximum of 100 participants (including functional staff) on the site at any one time. Through the registration and the load lists (booking list of each individual drop-off process) all contacts are completely traceable.

Further association activities such as eating together or the like will not take place for the time being, or in compliance with the applicable hygiene regulations. The campsite opens as specified by the Bavarian Ministry of the Interior on 30.05. for permanent campers and club members and their families. Relatives of club members may only enter the hangar of the FSZ for the use of the toilet areas.

Arrangements for training and tandem operations are set out in the Annex. (Annex A & B)

4. Hygiene officer

One (or more) hygiene officer(s) will be appointed to monitor compliance with the provisions of this hygiene concept and, in the event of violations, will first issue a warning to the appropriate jumper. In case of repeated violation the jumper will be expelled from the area.

If, in the opinion of the person responsible for hygiene, the jump operation cannot be carried out in accordance with the hygiene concept presented here due to too many violations, the person responsible for hygiene can cancel the jump operation and all participants must leave the area.

For this purpose, the board of directors of the FSZ Hassfurt e.V. assigns the domestic authority and the necessary competences to the person responsible for hygiene. Further details are set out in a separate service contract/guideline.

A representative must be appointed for the person responsible for hygiene, who will take over the duties of the person responsible for hygiene if the person responsible for hygiene is prevented from doing so.

Appendix A: Hygiene rules for training

Teaching will start on 26.06.2020. In general, all the points mentioned above apply. If possible, the safety distance should be maintained.

- Seamless documentation of all those present
- Theoretical training and theoretical examination is carried out outdoors if possible
- Distance rules in the training room are observed
- Opportunities for hand disinfection are provided
- Frequently touched objects are regularly disinfected
- The premises are regularly ventilated
- During safety equipment check, trailer training, exit exercises, etc.

Is mouth-nose protection and gloves worn

- Mouth and nose protectors and gloves must be brought by the students individually
- Regular cleaning of training equipment used by several students can be used.

Appendix B: Hygiene rules for tandem operation

Tandem operation will start on 20.06.2020. In general, all the above points apply. If possible, the safety distance should be maintained.

- Self declaration (freedom from cold symptoms) by the tandem guest and all accompanying persons
- Complete documentation of all present persons (also accompanying persons, such as for example the legal guardians of children, accompanying persons of people with disabilities)
- Tandempilot pays attention to the observance of the distance rules (generally, with briefing, contract of carriage, payment arrangements, etc.)
- For immediate jump preparation, execution and follow-up mouth-nose protection and gloves must be worn
- Suitable headgear for the tandem guest must be worn before each use fresh antiviral treatment. The use of balaclavas, Buffs, etc. under the headgear is recommended.
- Passenger harnesses must be cleaned regularly
